S	Achillea millifolium 'Cerise Queen' 2' Bright cherry red blooms		N
	<b>Actaea (bugbane / baneberry)    sun/pt.shade (reclassified from Cimicifuga)</b>		
F	Actaea racemosa 5-6' Native, slender spikes of white flowers in summer. Striking.		
L	Actaea simplex 'Brunette' 6' Fall blooming. Very fragrant. Dark stems and leaves, white flower spikes similar to Liatris. Takes shade.		
	<b>Agastache (anise hyssop)    sun</b>		
T	Agastache foeniculum 'Fragrant Delight' (lavender hyssop) 5' Colorful spikes of lavender flowers are edible, fragrant and good cut. Attracts hummingbirds, bees, butterflies. Rub crushed leaves on skin to repel mosquitos. Use as a seasoning and for tea.		L,V
S	Agastache pallida 'Globetrotter' 30" Dense spikes of lilac-pink flowers w/reddish bracts June to Sept. Terrific cut flowers. Combines beautifully with Echinacea and Penstemon.		N
S	Agastache rupestris 'Apache Sunset' 24" Tubular flowers in rich shades of peach, rose & orange, June to October. Excellent for cutting. Silver-gray, lacy foliage, provides striking contrast. Whole plant emits wonderful root beer-like fragrance.		N
	<b>Ajuga (bugleweed)    sun to shade</b>		
T	Ajuga pyramidalis 'Metallica Crispa' 6" Deep bronze-purple foliage w/metallic appearance that looks nice all year especially in sun. Short spikes of blue flowers in spring is stunning. Evergreen groundcover that can grow where grass is hard to establish. Not invasive.		N
S	Ajuga reptans 'Chocolate Chip' 8" Well behaved evergreen foliage is attractive year-round. Satin sheen finish embossed with rich hues of chocolate brown, bronze and maroon.		N
	<b>Alchemillia (lady's mantle)    sun/pt.shade</b>		
L	Alchemilla mollis 10-16" Handsome edger. Sprays of chartreuse flowers in July, splendid fan shaped pleated foliage that collect dew drops as sparkling jewels. Good cut flowers.		
	<b>Allium (ornamental onion)    sun + well drained soil</b>		
	<u>Allium General:</u> Drought tolerant. Very easy to grow, carefree, needs a dry location. Showy in mass. Flowers can be dried by standing upright in a container without water. Blossoms tower above foliage. Deer proof.		
T	Allium moly luteum 14" Golden Yellow star shaped flowers. Blooms May-June. Excellent for rock gardens and cut flower.		
T	Allium schoenoprasum 1-2' Abundant 1" globe red-pink flowers in spring, chive-like foliage		N
	<b>Amsonia (blue star)    sun/pt.shade</b>		
F	Amsonia tabernaemontana 3-4' Willow-like leaves, golden fall color, light blue starry flowers May-June. Easy to grow, long-lived structural plant.		V
	<b>Anemone (Japanese windflower)    pt.shade</b>		
T	Anemone hupehensis 'Pamina' 3' Vigorous, compact. Showy double 2½-3" rose-pink flowers of overlapping petals & yellow centers on long branching stems. Long bloom in late season.		

T		<b>Anemone hupehensis 'September Charm' 2-3'</b> Abundant silvery pink flowers late summer-fall. Attractive foliage. Valued for late season bloom.	
		<b>Aquilegia (columbine) sun to shade</b>	
		<b><u>Aquilegia General:</u></b> There are many forms of this wonderful flower: some form a delicate star of outer petals surrounding an inner ring with yellow centers - some have long spurs that project out behind the blossoms - others are spurless with double blossoms. All are graceful, with blue-green foliage. Aquilegia is easy to grow in loose, average to rich, well-drained soil. Self sows without being annoying.

T,F,P		<b>Aquilegia misc. (Anything Goes) 2'</b> Graceful, pendulous flowers of mixed colors, compact mounding bluish green foliage, easy care, reseeds. A wealth of flowers in sun or shade	
		<b>Arabis (rockcress) sun</b>	
S		<b>Arabis blepharophylla 'Rose Delight' 4-6"</b> Mat forming, evergreen perennial. Rosettes of oval, toothed, hairy-edged, dark green leaves & erect stems bearing clusters of purple-pink flowers in late spring & early summer. Rock garden or edging.	N
S		<b>Arabis caucasica 'Snowcap' 8"</b> Profuse pure white blooms in early spring cover the dense carpet of grey-green foliage.	N
		<b>Arisaema (Jack in the Pulpit) pt.shade/shade</b>	
T		<b>Arisaema sikokianum (Japanese Cobra Lily) 20-30"</b> A burgundy "horn" pops out of the ground in early spring revealing chocolate-purple & verticle white inner striping, & a snow-white spadix. Summer dormant. Seedheads look like small cobs of popcorn starting out green, ripening to yellow and then bright orange-red.	N
T		<b>Arisaema triphyllum 18-24"</b> Hooded bloom, striped in green, brown and white; scarlet-orange fruit in fall.	V
		<b>Aruncus (goatsbeard) pt.shade/shade</b>	
L		<b>Aruncus aethusifolius 18"</b> Dwarf variety. Fern-like leaves, it resembles astilbe, but more contained & compact. White flowers in summer.	V
F		<b>Aruncus dioicus 2'</b> Native. Fluffy white flower plumes to 6', resembles a giant astilbe with fern-like foliage. Tough as nails.	V
		<b>Asarum (ginger) (groundcover) pt.shade/shade</b>	
L,S		<b>Asarum europaeum 3"</b> Glossy green kidney-shaped foliage; elegant groundcover for shade. Easy, carefree.	
		<b>Asclepias (milkweed) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T		<b>Asclepias incarnata 3-4'</b> Small, fragrant, pink to mauve umbels in July-Aug. Flowers are attractive to butterflies & larval stage of Monarchs. Erect, clump-forming, with branching stems. Attractive 3-4" seed pods which split open when ripe releasing silky-haired seeds.	V
P,F		<b>Asclepias tuberosa 12"-24"</b> Clusters of yellow or orange flowers in summer, host and nectar plant for butterflies. Full sun.	V
		<b>Aster (Michaelmas daisies) sun/pt.shade</b>	
		<b><u>Aster General:</u></b> Asters are invaluable in the hardy border, adding superb color in the autumn. Very durable and long lived. Even heavy, wet soils will suit them. Mounds of color beginning in September, in a full range of colors. Pinch back before July for best display.	
T		<b>Aster novae-angliae 'Purple Dome' 20"</b> Compact and free flowering. A stunning, deep purple. Disease resistant.	V
T		<b>Aster novi-belgii 'Raspberry Swirl' 2'</b> Compact. Vivid deep raspberry-red daisy-like flowers with contrasting yellow centers. The foliage is mildew resistant.	V
		<b>Astilbe (false spiraea / plume flower) pt.shade/shade</b>	
		<b><u>Astilbe General:</u></b> Attractive delicate fern-like foliage with showy frothy plumes midsummer in shades of pink, peach, white, rose, red. Lush deeply cut foliage is attractive for the entire season and is colored from green to bronze. Prefers rich moist soil. Can take sun if well watered. Deer resistant.	
T		<b>Astilbe arendsii 'Sister Theresa' 2'</b> Full and blocky, soft salmon-pink lavish blooms in midsummer over shiny, dark green foliage with a hint of purple. Very reliable grower.	
L		<b>Astilbe chinensis v. pumila 10"</b> Dwarf variety with red-green leaves. Great used as groundcover. Striking plume-like flowers of reddish pink	

L,M	<b>Astilbe hybrids misc. 2-3'</b> Long lasting feathery plumes in summer, fern like foliage. Bright pink, pale pink, or white.	
	<b>Astrantia (masterwort) pt.shade</b>	
L	<b>Astrantia major misc. 18"</b> Pink tinged 1" white flowers, midsummer long bloomer.	
	<b>BAMBOO sun/pt.shade</b>	
A	<b>Phyllostachys aureosulcata (Yellow Groove Bamboo) 25'</b> Evergreen bamboo. Invasive if not maintained within bounds.	
	<b>Baptisia (false indigo) sun/pt.shade</b>	
M	<b>Baptisia australis 3-4'</b> 2010 PPA Plant of the Year. Spikes of 12" blue lupine-like blooms, long lived & carefree. Bushy clump of blue-green foliage, good cut foliage & flowers, attractive seed pods for crafting.	V
T	<b>Baptisia 'Purple Smoke' 3'-4'</b> Violet blue lupine-like flower. Smokey purple stems, gray green unique foliage. Vigorous, structural & long lasting.	V
	<b>Belamcanda (blackberry lily) sun</b>	
F	<b>Belamcanda 2'-3'</b> Speckled orange or yellow flowers, tall stems, iris like foliage, summer	
	<b>Brunnera (Siberian bugloss) pt.shade – moist soil</b>	
P	<b>Brunnera macrophylla 12-18"</b> Lovely shade perennial, sky blue flowers in April/May. Resembles a giant forget-me-not! Resents dry soil.	
	<b>Campanula (bellflower) sun/pt.shade</b>	
	<b><u>Campaula General:</u></b> Campanulas are marvelous and one of our favorites! A large genus from low growing to tall stately specimens (mostly blue or purple, but also white, pink, rose, lavender flowers). Long lived, easy care.	
T	<b>Campanula glomerata 'Superba' 1-2'</b> Upward facing clusters of richly colored violet 'bells'. Blooms heavily in late spring through early summer.	
L	<b>Campanula glomerata misc. 1'</b> Clusters of purple or white flowers on a 12" spike.	
F	<b>Campanula persicifolia misc. 8" (2-3' in bloom)</b> Sky blue or white cup shaped bells on graceful spikes in early summer. Good cut flower. Will rebloom if spikes are cut.	
T	<b>Campanula misc. 6-8"</b> 2" creamy white bells on 10" stalks with spotted wine interior. Vigorous.	
	<b>Centaurea (cornflower) sun/pt.shade</b>	
L	<b>Centaurea montana 2'</b> Violet blue showy fringed flowers, lance-like silvery green foliage, cut back after flowering for rebloom	
	<b>Cerastium (snow-in-summer) sun</b>	
T	<b>Cerastium tomentosum 6"</b> Good for walls, walkways and rock gardens, everlasting silver fine leafed foliage, groundcover, masses of tiny white flowers in May-June, drought tolerant	
	<b>Chrysanthemum (garden mums) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T	<b>Chrysanthemum koreana 'Sheffield' (aka Dendranthema rubellum) 30"</b> Salmon pink yellow-eyed daisy flowers in abundance, very long flowering. A mound of color in late season.	
M	<b>Chrysanthemum nipponicum (Montauk daisy) 2-3'</b> White flowers late summer/fall	
F	<b>Chrysanthemum misc. 2'</b> Pale pink, September/October bloom	
	<b>Convallaria (lily of the valley) pt.shade/shade</b>	
A	<b>Convallaria majalis rosea 6-8"</b> Rare! Pink form with very fragrant flowers in May. Spreads very slowly.	N
	<b>Coreopsis (tickseed) sun/pt.shade</b>	
F	<b>Coreopsis tripteris 5-6'</b> Statuesque with 2" butter yellow daisies in July and September. Birds love the seeds. Deer resistant. Native.	V
K	<b>Coreopsis grandiflora 'Presto' 6-8"</b> Double golden 2-2½" blooms on small plant. Good for containers.	N,V
K	<b>Coreopsis pubescens 'Sunshine Superman' 10-12"</b> Golden flowers on a low bushy mound.	N,V
	<b>Corydalis (cordyalis) sun to shade</b>	
T,F,P	<b>Corydalis lutea 8-12"</b> Delicate leafy foliage, free flowering from May to September, cheery yellow flowers. Prefers rich, moist soils that don't dry out in summer but not wet in winter.	
	<b>Cryptotaenia (Japanese parsley) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T,F	<b>Cryptotaenia japonica atropurpurea 26"</b> Attractive chocolate colored maple-like foliage, tiny pale pink flowers, nice for color contrast in borders. Self seeds.	

	<b>Dianthus (pinks) sun + well drained soil</b>	
T,S	<b>Dianthus deltoides 'Arctic Fire' 6-10"</b> White petals with a red eye. Low grey leaved plants.	N
S	<b>Dianthus deltoides 'Zing Rose' 6-9"</b> Bright rose-red flowers over a mounding clump of bright green leaves	N
	<b>Dicentra (bleeding heart) pt.shade/shade</b>	
T,P	<b>Dicentra eximia (fringed bleeding heart) 15"</b> Ferny, grayish-green foliage. Pink nodding heart-shaped flowers spring through summer.	V
P,M	<b>Dicentra spectabilis misc. 2-3'</b> Sprays of pendant, heart-shaped flowers above fern-like foliage in spring. Showy deep rose or white. Summer dormant.	
	<b>Digitalis (foxglove) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T	<b>Digitalis lutea (perennial) 3'</b> Creamy yellow flowers. Stalks are lined with many creamy yellow flowers. Simple elegance. Glossy green, narrow-leaved foliage.	
S	<b>Digitalis purpurea 'Foxy' 1-3'</b> Enormous spires of large, dangling bells in soft pastel shades from cream to pink and rose in spring. Low rosette of coarse, hairy leaves - compact selection. Reseeds freely.	N
	<b>Echinacea (coneflower) sun/pt.shade</b>	
	<b><u>Echinacea General:</u></b> One of the best border plants. Flower petals radiate downward from a pronounced central seed head. Excellent cut flower, attractive to butterflies. Easy to grow. Flowers from July to frost.	
M	<b>Echinacea 'Green Jewel' 3'</b> Bright green petals, darker green cone	
M	<b>Echinacea 'Milkshake' 3'</b> Large double white pompom flowers	
M	<b>Echinacea 'Hot Papaya' 3'</b> Double orange/red flowers	
	<b>Echinacea paradoxa (Ozark coneflower) 2-3'</b> Native, yellow flowers, parent of most of the newer hybrids. Seeds a favorite of goldfinches. Blooms all summer.	V
M	<b>Echinacea 'Pink Double Delight' 3'</b> Double pink flowers	
T	<b>Echinacea 'Pow Wow Wild Berry' 2'</b> Floriferous bright pink flowers that don't fade. Has won numerous honors.	
M	<b>Echinacea purpurea 'Marmalade' 32"</b> Orange poodle-like top with banana yellow petals falling straight down underneath.	N
T,L,P	<b>Echinacea purpurea 3'</b> Big daisy-like lavender pink blooms on stately plants. Showy! Easy care.	V
	<b>Epimedium (barrenwort / bishop's hat) pt.shade/shade</b>	
	<b><u>Epimedium General:</u></b> A terrific woodland plant that fills in under trees and in dry shade! Spring blooming with orchid-like flowers in many colors. Pest free. Evergreen colorful foliage can be cut back early spring before flowering. Resilient & tough.	
T,P	<b>Epimedium perralchicum 'Frohnleiten' 15"</b> Spectacular hybrid with superbly red mottled leaves in spring. Clumps topped with panicles of large butter-yellow flowers. Great specimen.	N
L	<b>Epimedium rubrum 8-12"</b> Bright crimson and cream white flowers, spring bloom. Pointed, heart-shaped leaflets on wiry stems, new growth has reddish tinge, reddish fall color.	
M	<b>Epimedium rubrum 'Sweetheart' 8-12"</b> Pink flowers, spring bloom. Pointed, heart-shaped leaflets on wiry stems, new growth has reddish tinge, reddish fall color.	N
T,P	<b>Epimedium warleyense 1'</b> Loose clusters of flowers w/coppery orange-red inner sepals & spurred yellow petals in spring resemble small columbines. Heart-shaped basal foliage tinged with purple on emerging.	N
P	<b>Epimedium misc. 1'</b> Loose clusters of flowers w/spurred petals resemble small columbines. Heart-shaped basal foliage is often tinged with purple on emerging. Resilient & tough.	
	<b>Eryngium sun</b>	
F	<b>Eryngium yuccifolium (rattlesnake master) 3'-5'</b> Tall perennial with spiky foliage and white thistle like flowers, very architectural.	N,V
	<b>Euphorbia (spurge) sun/pt.shade</b>	
T	<b>Euphorbia amygdaloides purpurea 12-18"</b> Handsome burgundy-purple foliage sets off clusters of bright greenish-yellow flowers in mid-late spring. Remains evergreen. Self seeds.	
T	<b>Euphorbia corollata 2-3'</b> Showy masses of tiny, dainty white flowers in huge sprays. Blooms summer into fall. Drought resistant. Small jade green leaves turn red in autumn. Slow to break dormancy & difficult to propagate. I love this plant!	

T		<b>Euphorbia dulcis 'Chameleon' 12-18"</b> Yellow flowers with the outer bracts turning chartreuse. Luscious purple-maroon foliage - the more sun the deeper the foliage. Self seeds.	
		<b>FERNS <i>pt.shade/shade</i></b>	
T		<b>Athyrium niponicum 'Pictum' (Japanese painted fern) 16"</b> <u>2004 Perennial Plant of the Year!</u> A showy combination of colorful fronds of grey-green blended with wine red. Lacy leaves are wide and taper to a delicate point. Deer resistant.	
P		<b>Adiantum pedatum 'Maidenhair' 30"</b> Hardy and fast growing fern with delicate appearance. Rich green fronds on black stems. Needs good air circulation.	
		<b>Filipendula (meadowsweet) <i>sun/shade</i></b>	
L		<b>Filipendula hexapetala misc. 2'</b> Native perennial bears heads of fluffy creamy white flowers above fern like foliage.	
L		<b>Filipendula 'Kahome' 1'</b> Sprays of rosy flowers over green rosettes, July-August.	
L		<b>Filipendula palmata 'Nana' 16"</b> Mounding habit. Feathery plumes of rosy-pink flowers.	
L		<b>Filipendula rubra</b> Foamy pink flower on 3' – 5' stalk over mound of lower ferny leaves.	N
L		<b>Filipendula ulmaria 'Variagata' 2'</b> Creamy white flowers over variagated yellow & green leaves	
		<b>Fragaria (ornamental strawberry) <i>sun</i></b>	
L		<b>Fragaria 'Lipstick' 4- 6"</b> Glossy 'running' strawberry type foliage with bright rosy flowers, blooms late summer to fall. Carefree.	
		<b>Gaura (wand flower) <i>sun</i></b>	
T		<b>Gaura lindheimeri 'Whirling Butterflies' 3-4'</b> Vase shaped plant, white flowers dance in a breeze on arching stems, blooms through October, nice in center of border, low basal foliage, hardier than pink variety.	V
		<b>Geranium (cranesbill) <i>sun/pt.shade</i></b>	
		<u><b>Geranium General:</b></u> Easy to grow, dense mound attractive foliage, masses of flowers. Cut back taller varieties after first bloom to renew foliage and encourage rebloom.	
L		<b>Geranium cantabrigiense 'Biokovo' 8"</b> Large blush-white flowers. June bloom with excellent rebloom throughout summer. Very hardy in sun or shade.	N
T,L		<b>Geranium macrorrhizum 12-18"</b> A great groundcover geranium. Light pink flowers w/darker sepals & stems are held high above wonderfully fragrant foliage. Tolerates bright shade & drier soils. Reblooms.	
T		<b>Geranium maculatum 18"</b> Pinkish lilac flowers in spring. Scalloped green foilage. Foilage scalloped green turning red in fall. Clump forming.	V
L		<b>Geranium phaeum 12"</b> Attractive foliage with purple markings and small, reflexed burgundy flowers. Very hardy in sun to light shade.	
T		<b>Geranium sanguineum 'Vision Violet' 8-12"</b> Vivid masses of purple-pink blooms produced all summer over a sprawling mound of deep green, heavily divided foliage. Use as edging.	
T		<b>Geranium sylvaticum 'Brookside' (?) 2'</b> Long-flowering hybrid forms sprawling mound of deeply-cut green foliage, bearing large cup-shaped violet-blue flowers with white eye. Cut back hard after blooming to encourage fresh new foliage.	N
F		<b>Geranium misc. 12-18"</b> Dark pink, magenta, white or carmine rose flowers	
		<b>Geum (avens) <i>sun</i></b>	
T,P		<b>Geum triflorum 'Praire Smoke' 1'</b> Nodding, pinkish-maroon flowers in spring w/unique feathery pink seedheads that resemble cotton candy . Upright, ferny foliage. Spreads slowly to make low growing groundcover. Drought tolerant. Thrives in well-drained soil.	N,V
		<b>GRASSES &amp; GRASS-LIKE PLANTS</b>	
		<u><b>Note:</b></u> Grasses make a marvelous addition to a perennial border and add much desired fall interest as well as structural form. Plumes or seed heads as well as grass blades can be used in flower or dried arrangements. They are long-lived, sustainable, easy to grow. Grasses below are clumping unless otherwise noted.	
T		<b>Acorus gramineus 'Ogon' (sweet flag) 6-12"</b> <i>sun/pt.shade</i> Evergreen foliage with rich yellow variegation. Likes wet feet. Excellent in containers.	
T		<b>Carex glauca (C. flacca) (sedge) 4-8"</b> <i>sun/pt.shade</i> Marvelous evergreen w/narrow blue-grey grass-like leaves. Adds nice texture to the garden or use as border. Strong grower to 6-12" wide, takes competition from tree roots & light foot traffic.	



F	<b>Carex 'Silver Scepter' (sedge) 6-12" sun/pt.shade</b> Evergreen sedge w/green & creamy white striped variegation. Drought tolerant once established, also grows in bogs. Good for containers. <b>N</b>
T,F	<b>Chasmanthum latifolium 'Northern Sea Oats' 3' pt.shade</b> Interesting flat oat-like tan seed fronds on arching panicles in fall, excellent winter interest and good dried. A great grass! <b>V</b>
T,P	<b>Hakonechloa macra 'Naomi' (Japanese forest grass) 18-14" pt. to full shade</b> Creamy yellow & green variegated leaves flushed with reddish-purple tones in fall. Slow grower. Plant to cascade, drape, crawl in front of garden or in containers. Tiny reddish brown flower spiklets in airy clusters late summer through early fall. <b>N</b>
T	<b>Miscanthus sinensis Strictus (porcupine grass) 6'-7' sun</b> Neat foliage, yellow bands on green leaves.
T	<b>Pennisetum alopecuroides 'Little Bunny' (miniature fountain grass) 6"-12" sun</b> Truly miniature w/cream-colored, tufted seed heads that look like a bunch of little bunnies' tails dancing. Suited to sunny rock gardens.
	<b>Helianthus (perennial sunflower) sun</b>
F	<b>Helianthus 'Lemon Queen' 5'-6'</b> Tall with numerous 2" yellow flowers late summer <b>V</b>
	<b>Heliopsis (false sunflower) sun/pt.shade</b>
T	<b>Heliopsis helianthoides 'Lorraine Sunshine' 30"</b> Large yellow daisy flowers all summer, variegated foliage <b>V</b>
T,P	<b>Heliopsis helianthoides scarba 'Sunburst' 30-36"</b> Cream and green variegated foliage and single 2-2 1/2", golden yellow single, daisy-like blooms in summer. <b>N,V</b>
	<b>Helleborus (lenten rose, hellebore) pt.shade/shade</b>
	<b><u>Helleborus General:</u></b> One of our favorites! Woodland plants with clumps of attractive glossy evergreen leaves and clusters of cup shaped flowers. Earliest perennial to bloom in late winter. Float flowers in bowl of water. Good beneath deciduous trees. Deer resistant & slug proof.
T	<b>Helleborus argutifolius 15-18"</b> Awesome clusters of large heads of uniform apple green flowers that last in water. Stout stems & sharply spined leaves mark it apart from other hellebores.
